### **Abstinence**

"The frequency of the warnings and the continued abstinence of Mr. B with respect to Hiroshima had made its citizens jittery;" The fact or practice of restraining oneself from indulging in something, typically alcohol.

### Convivial

"At fifty, he was healthy, <u>convivial</u>, and calm, and he was pleased to pass the evenings drinking whiskey with friends, always sensibly and for the sake of conversation.

(Of a person) cheerful and friendly; jovial.

### **Debris**

"Timbers fell around her as she landed, and a shower of tiles pommelled her; everything became dark, for she was buried. The <u>debris</u> did not cover her deeply."

Scattered pieces of waste or remains.

### **Diocese**

"This morning, a Monday, the only worshippers were Mr. Takemoto, a theological student living in the mission house; Mr. Fukai, the secretary of the diocese..."

A district under the pastoral care of a bishop in the Christian Church.

### **Evacuate**

"Mr. Kiyoshi Tanimoto, pastor of the Hiroshima Methodist Church... prepared to unload a handcart full of things he had evacuated from town in fear of the massive B-29 raid Remove (someone) from a place of danger to a safer place.

### **Hedonistic**

"Dr. Masakazu Fujii, being prosperous, <u>hedonistic</u>, and, at the time, not too busy, had been allowing himself the luxury of sleeping until nine or nine-thirty..."

Engaged in the pursuit of pleasure; sensually self-indulgent.

# Incendiary

"The prefectural government... had begun to press with threats and warnings for the completion of wide fire lanes... to localize any fires started by an <u>incendiary</u> raid. (Of a device or attack) designed to cause fires.

#### Incessant

"According to Japanese custom, when a person falls sick and goes to a hospital, one or more members of his family go... to offer <u>incessant</u> familial sympathy..." . (Of something regarded as unpleasant) continuing without pause or interruption.

### Intermittent

"He said that she should remain at home unless an urgent warning—a series of intermittent blasts of the siren—was sounded."

Occurring at irregular intervals; not continuous or steady.

### **Notorious**

"Mr. Tanaka... a man famous in Hiroshima for his showy philanthropies and <u>notorious</u> for his personal tyrannies, had been telling people that Tanimoto shouldn't be trusted

Famous or well known, typically for some bad quality or deed.

### **Parish**

"The effort of moving the piano the day before, a sleepless night... the cares of his <u>parish</u>—all combined to make him feel hardly adequate to the new day's work."

(In the Christian Church) an administrative district typically having its own church and a priest.

# **Parsonage**

"He was alone in the <u>parsonage</u>, because for some time his wife had been commuting with their year-old baby to spend nights with a friend in Ushida, a suburb to the north

A church house provided for a member of the clergy.

### **Perish**

"If he had had to wait a few minutes for the streetcar, as often happened, he would have been close to the center at the time of the explosion and would... have perished."

Suffer death, typically in a violent, sudden, or untimely way.

# **Philanthropy**

"Mr. Tanaka... a man famous in Hiroshima for his showy <u>philanthropies</u> and notorious for his personal tyrannies, had been telling people that Tanimoto shouldn't be trusted

The desire to promote the welfare of others, expressed especially by a generous donation.

### **Pommel**

"Timbers fell around her as she landed, and a shower of tiles <u>pommelled</u> her; everything became dark, for she was buried." Hit repeatedly.

#### **Prominence**

"The <u>prominence</u> of the frontal bones just above his eyebrows and the smallness of his mustache, mouth, and chin give him a strange, old-young look..."

The state of being important, famous, or noticeable.

# **Proprietor**

"Dr. Fujii was the <u>proprietor</u> of a peculiarly Japanese institution, a private, single-doctor hospital."

The owner of a business, or a holder of property.

# **Prosperous**

"Isawa had been a not particularly <u>prosperous</u> tailor, and his only capital was a Sankoku sewing machine."

Successful in material terms; flourishing financially.

### Reconnaissance

"(The Japanese radar operators, detecting only three planes, supposed that they comprised a reconnaissance.)"

Military observation of a region to locate an enemy or ascertain strategic features.

### Rendezvous

"Hiroshima had been getting such warnings almost every night for weeks, for at that time the B-29s were using Lake Biwa, northeast of Hiroshima, as a <u>rendezvous</u> point A meeting at an agreed time and place, typically between two people.

# Repugnant

"Satisfied that nothing would happen, he went in and breakfasted with the other Fathers on substitute coffee and ration bread which... was especially repugnant to him

Extremely distasteful; unacceptable.

## **Tyranny**

"Mr. Tanaka... a man famous in Hiroshima for his showy philanthropies and notorious for his personal <u>tyrannies</u>, had been telling people that Tanimoto shouldn't be trusted

Cruel and oppressive government or rule.

## **Volition**

"Each of them counts... items of chance or volition—a step taken in time, a decision to go indoors, catching one streetcar instead of the next—that spared him."

The faculty or power of using one's will.

# **Xenophobic**

"The Japanese wartime diet had not sustained him, and he felt the strain of being a foreigner in an increasingly xenophobic Japan;" Having or showing a dislike of or prejudice against people from other countries.
