## **Capricious**

"These four did not realize it, but they were coming down with the strange, <u>capricious</u> disease which came later to be known as radiation sickness."

Given to sudden and unaccountable changes of mood or behavior.

### **Caricature**

"The row of dowdy banks, <u>caricaturing</u> a shaken economic system;"

Make a comically or grotesquely exaggerated representation of (someone or something).

### **Consecrate**

"His son said, 'Father, we can do nothing except make our mind up to <u>consecrate</u> our lives for the country."

Make or declare (something, typically a church) sacred.

### Crux

"The <u>crux</u> of the matter is whether total war in its present form is justifiable, even when it serves a just purpose."

The decisive or most important point at issue.

# Decrepit

"The houses on the outskirts of the city, standing but decrepit, with broken windows and dishevelled tiles;"

Old and in bad condition or poor health.

#### **Destitute**

"A year after the bomb was dropped, Miss Sasaki was a cripple; Mrs. Nakamura was <u>destitute</u>;"

Without money, food, a home, or possessions.

#### **Diastase**

"He... just stretched her out on a mat and prescribed aspirin for her fever, and glucose intravenously and <u>diastase</u> orally for her undernourishment..."

An enzyme that breaks down starch into maltose, then dextrose, and is present in malt.

#### **Emanation**

"It was that the atomic bomb had deposited some sort of poison on Hiroshima which would give off deadly emanations for seven years;" Something that comes forth from a source; thing emitted.

## **Ethics**

"A surprising number of the people of Hiroshima remained more or less indifferent about the <u>ethics</u> of using the bomb."

Moral principles that govern a person's behavior or the conducting of an activity.

## Façade

"A painter on a ladder was monumentalized in a kind of bas-relief on the stone <u>façade</u> of a bank building... in the act of dipping his brush into his paint can;"

The front of a building.

## **Hemorrhage**

"Her skin and visible mucous membranes were heavily spotted with petechiae, which are <a href="hemorrhages">hemorrhages</a> about the size of grains of rice, or even as big as soybeans;"

An escape of blood from a ruptured blood vessel, especially when profuse.

## **Macabre**

"And in the streets a <u>macabre</u> traffic—hundreds of crumpled bicycles, shells of streetcars and automobiles, all halted in mid-motion."

Disturbing and horrifying because of involvement with or depiction of death and injury.

### **Malaise**

"Mr. Tanimoto fell suddenly ill with a general <u>malaise</u>, weariness, and feverishness, and he, too, took to his bedroll on the floor of the half-wrecked house of a friend"

A general feeling of discomfort, illness, or uneasiness whose exact cause is difficult to identify.

#### Morbid

"She had been growing more and more depressed and morbid; she seemed little interested in living."

Of, relating to, or characteristic of disease.

## **Prognosis**

"The two key symptoms, on which the doctors came to base their <u>prognosis</u>, were fever and the lowered white-corpuscle count."

A doctor's opinion about how someone will recover from an illness or injury.

#### Remnant

"Sickle senna grew in extraordinary regeneration, not only standing among the charred <u>remnants</u> of the same plant but pushing up in new places, among bricks..."

A small remaining quantity of something.

## **Retrospect**

"The doctors realized in <u>retrospect</u> that even though most of these dead had also suffered from burns and blast effects, they had absorbed enough radiation to kill them." A survey or review of a past course of events or period of time.

## Succumb

"The apparently uninjured people who had died so mysteriously in the first few hours or days had <a href="succumbed">succumbed</a> in this first stage."

To be brought to an end (such as death) by the effect of destructive or disruptive forces.

### **Swathe**

"He noticed... a curious syndrome of symptoms that cropped out in the third and fourth weeks, but he was not able to do much more than <a href="mailto:swathe">swathe</a> cuts and burns."

Wrap in several layers of fabric.

## **Talisman**

"He had begun to think that this bag, in which he kept his valuables, had a <u>talismanic</u> quality, because of the way he had found it after the explosion..."

An object held to act as a charm to avert evil and bring good fortune.

#### Tibia

"She had a compound fracture of the left tibia, with swelling of the left lower leg;"

The inner and typically larger of the two bones between the knee and the ankle.

### Verdant

"The <u>verdancy</u> rose even from the foundations of ruined houses. Weeds already hid the ashes, and wild flowers were in bloom among the city's bones."

Green with growing plants.

## Vitality

"Mr. Tanimoto's church had been ruined and he no longer had his exceptional <u>vitality</u>."

The state of being strong and active; energy.

#### Yen

"It came to Mrs. Nakamura's attention that a carpenter from Kabe was building a number of wooden shanties in Hiroshima which he rented for fifty <u>yen</u> a month..."

The unit of currency that is used in Japan.
