While planning your timeline, be sure to conduct research on each event so you can provide a detailed and accurate response. You should also familiarize yourself with any pictures associated with each event so you can draw visuals that relate to and enhance the quality of the information you include. Make your timeline visually appealing by adding pictures, maps, charts, quotes, etc. Arrange your timeline and write up of events in the proper order of years in which they occurred.
