## Remembering the Fallen

Select an event of the Second World War (such as the attack on Pearl Harbor, Battle of Midway, the bombing of Japan, or a different Second World War event if you have been given teacher approval) and design a memorial (statue, monument, fountain, park, sculpture, etc.) using any form you like. On a separate sheet of paper, propose a location where the memorial should be built along with an explanation of why you chose this place. Include in your write up the words of an inscription which informs visitors to the memorial of: the event that the memorial commemorates, the date of the event, the people that it commemorates, how many died, how and why they died, where they died, and why the event is significant. While planning your memorial, be sure to conduct research on your event so you can provide a detailed and accurate response.
