## Benign

"A stout slow man sat in an office waiting. His face was fatherly and <u>benign</u>, and his eyes twinkled with friendship."

Gentle and kindly.

Climb, move, or get in or out of something in an awkward

and laborious way.

### Clamber

"The neighbours peered around the doorway, and a line of little boys <u>clambered</u> on the window bars and looked through."

## Clumsy

"On the contrary," said the dealer, "it is large and <u>clumsy</u>. As a curiosity it has interest; some museum might perhaps take it to place in a collection of seashells."

Awkward in movement or in handling things.

# Coagulate

"He felt the creeping of fate, the circling of wolves, the hover of vultures. He felt the evil <u>coagulating</u> about him, and he was helpless to protect himself."

# Collusion

"I am only an appraiser. Ask the others. Go to their offices and show your pearl - or better, let them come here, so that you can see there is no <u>collusion</u>."

"The hand tossed the great pearl back in the tray, the

forefinger poked and insulted it, and on the dealer's face there came a sad and <u>contemptuous</u> smile." Secret or illegal cooperation or conspiracy, especially in

order to cheat or deceive others.

(Of a fluid, especially blood) change to a solid or

semisolid state.

#### Showing contempt; scornful.

# Dignity

"Kino stepped with <u>dignity</u> out of the house, and Juana followed him, carrying Coyotito." The state or quality of being worthy of honor or respect.

### Extravagant

"But this was a wasteful method, for often, in the excitement of bidding for a fine pearl, too great a price had been paid to the fishermen. This was <u>extravagant</u>"

Lacking restraint in spending money or using resources.

## Legerdemain

"His door stood open to the morning, and he hummed under his breath while his right hand practiced legerdemain."

Skill in using your hands to perform magic tricks.

## Lethargy

"Long after Juan Tomás had gone Kino sat brooding on his sleeping-mat. A <u>lethargy</u> had settled on him, and a little gray hopelessness." A lack of energy and enthusiasm.

## Monstrosity

"Do not include me in the discussion," he said dryly. "I will make no offer at all. I do not want it. This is not a pearl - it is a <u>monstrosity</u>." His thin lips curled."

#### Something that is outrageously or offensively wrong.

### Perplex

"Now Kino's face was <u>perplexed</u> and worried. "It is the Pearl of the World," he cried. "No one has ever seen such a pearl." To confuse (someone) very much.

#### Peso

"I can give you, say, a thousand pesos."

Rampart

"The Father made it clear that each man and woman is... part of the castle of the Universe. And some are in the <u>ramparts</u> and some far deep in the darkness of the walls" The basic unit of money of Mexico and several other Latin American countries.

A tall, thick stone or dirt wall that is built around a castle, town, etc., to protect it from attacks.

## Scuffle

"The gathering procession was solemn... and any children who showed a tendency to <u>scuffle</u>, to scream, to cry out... were hissed to silence by their elders."

To fight briefly and usually not very seriously.

### Sermon

"I have heard him make that <u>sermon</u>," said Juan Tomás. "He makes it every year." A speech about a moral or religious subject that is usually given by a religious leader.

# Solemn

"The gathering procession was <u>solemn</u>... and any children who showed a tendency to scuffle, to scream, to cry out... were hissed to silence by their elders." Very serious or formal in manner, behavior, or expression.

#### Spurn

"The dealer's fingers <u>spurned</u> the pearl so that it bounced and rebounded softly from the side of the velvet tray." To reject with disdain or contempt.

### Stalwart

"So important was this day that an old man came to see, riding on the <u>stalwart</u> shoulders of his nephew." Loyal, reliable, and hardworking.

### Stout

"A <u>stout</u> slow man sat in an office waiting. His face was fatherly and benign, and his eyes twinkled with friendship."

#### (Of a person) somewhat fat or of heavy build.

### Tithe

"Word of it crept in among the nuns; the beggars in front of the church spoke of it, for they would be there to take the <u>tithe</u> of the first fruits of the luck." One tenth of annual produce or earnings, formerly taken as a tax for the support of the Church.

#### Tremor

"And the dealer heard a little grumble go through the crowd as they heard his price. And the dealer felt a little <u>tremor</u> of fear."

An involuntary quivering movement.

### Vigor

"Kino put on his large straw hat and felt it with his hand to see that it was properly placed... tilted a little forward to show aggressiveness and seriousness and <u>vigor</u>." Strength, energy, or determination.

### Wary

"His eyes were entranced, and he could sense the <u>wary</u>, watchful evil outside the brush house;" Feeling or showing caution about possible dangers or problems.
