| Board- (Of a student) to be supplied with food and lodging at school during a semester in return for \$. |
| Bore-To make (a hole) in something by drilling with a cutting instrument. |
| Hew- To make, shape, smooth, etc., with cutting blows of a cutting instrument. |
| Marvel- To feel great surprise, wonder, or admiration. |
| Meagre- Not enough in quality or amount. |
| Passport- An official document issued by a government, certifying the holder's identity and citizenship and entitling them to travel under its protection to and from foreign countries. |
| Scroll- A roll of parchment, paper, or other material, especially one with writing on it. |
| Strew- Be scattered or spread untidily over (a surface or area). |
| Teller- A person employed to deal with customers' transactions in a bank. |
| Thistle- A wild plant that has sharp points on its leaves and purple, yellow, or white flowers. |
| Throttle- Attack or kill (someone) by choking or strangling them. |
